son who trusts in Jesus?

Read: John 10:27-30

Discuss: How does Jesus describe our eternal life with Him?

Read: Romans 8:16

Discuss: What does God's Spirit do for the believer?

Apply: Believers in Jesus are sometimes plagued with doubts about

their salvation; settle your doubts permanently by trusting completely what God has said about your eternal security. Write your commitment down somewhere permanent (like

the front of your Bible).

order to go to Heaven?

Apply: If you have trusted in Christ alone for your salvation and have

not yet been baptized, contact a pastor so you can be bap-

tized soon in obedience to His command/Word.

Read: Ephesians 6:10-18 (1 Peter 5:8; 1 John 4:4) **Discuss:** What are the pieces of the "armor of God"?

Read: Galatians 5:16

Discuss: How can you "walk in the Spirit" every moment of your life?

Apply: Practice putting on each piece of spiritual armor at the

beginning of every day this week.

Memorize: Galatians 2:20 (Write the verse in the space below.)

Discuss: How can memorizing the Bible help you resist temptation?

Apply: Choose a verse to memorize as a weapon against temp-

tation. (Suggestions - Job 31:1; Psalm 101:3; Galatians 5:24;

Philippians 4:8; James 4:7; 2 Timothy 2:22)

As a group, commit to be available to help each other resist

temptation.

Read: Psalm 66:18; Proverbs 28:13

Discuss: What are the consequences when a child of God sins?

Read: 1 John 1:9 (Psalm 119:9; Isaiah 1:18; Psalm 51:1-17; James 5:16) **Discuss:** What should you do immediately when you sin against God?

Apply: Practice triple confession this week: stop and confess to God

immediately when you sin, confess all of your sins before you sleep, and also share your struggles with your disciple group

(James 5:16).

Memorize: 1 John 1:9 (Write the verse in the space below.)

Discuss: What other "lords" want to run your life?

Read: 1 Corinthians 10:31 (Colossians 1:9-20)

Discuss: What should be your goal in everything you do?

Apply: Establish a "fast" this week from the thing that competes most

with God in your life. Hold each other accountable and help

each other be successful with this fast.

Memorize: 1 Corinthians 10:31 (Write the verse in the space below.)

Apply: This week, ask God to show you areas of your life that

you are holding back from Him, and then surrender those things back to His control. Tell your group about

your commitment.
