- Serve as the Spiritual Shepherd of the children by overseeing and caring for them
- Teach children basic Biblical truths regarding Jesus which is essential to their own discipleship
- Help children understand the significance of accepting Jesus as Lord and Savior
- Celebrate the milestones of our children

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide vision and leadership for children's ministry
- Work alongside Kids Ministry Team providing a biblically sound, fun, and vibrant kids program
- Recruit, equip, train, and inspire volunteers
- Maintain program growth through promotion, inviting, and personal conversations
- Utilize the spiritual gifts of the congregation
- Attend weekly staff meetings
- Conduct Background checks & educate adults on protocol when working with children
- Direct & execute Sunday morning and Wednesday night programming to meet our vision
- Oversee annual MEGA Summer Camp and Word Of Life Summer Camp (off campus)
- Evaluate new curriculum as needed

FELLOWSHIP EVENTS/MISSION OPPORTUNITIES

- Direct and plan Seasonal Activities for Children; Easter Fest, Fall Festival, Back to School, etc.
- Direct and assist with SUPER Sundays, KIDS Church, breakfast gatherings, and off campus trips
- Encourage, and help assist with mission projects geared toward teaching children to serve

EXPERIENCE/SKILLS

- Organizational skills (self-starter, detail-oriented, multi-tasking, and can delegate)
